On the 24th September, Police stopped an unregistered off road trail bike in Beck Hole. The rider was arrested after providing a positive roadside breath test, which was three times the drink drive limit. The rider of the motorcycle has been charged to attend Scarborough Magistrates court on 9th October 2017 for driving whilst over the prescribed limit, driving whilst disqualified, driving without insurance, using a vehicle without a test certificate and failing to wear protective head gear.
